

Why Join Temple Beth Sholom?

A synagogue is a special place because it nurtures three things that infuse life with meaning and fulfillment: community, learning and spirituality.





Community (Beit K'nesset)

TBS is the place where we celebrate life-cycle events with family and friends, support one another in times of crisis and bring friends together.

Learning (Beit Midrash)

TBS is also a house of study where we come together to learn Torah, prayer, history, ethics and much more. We provide a wide array of study experiences for children as well as adults. Thus, we learn how to live a more enriched life and transmit our precious legacy from one generation to the next.

Spirituality (Beit Tefilah)

Finally, TBS is a house of prayer in which we create sacred time and space. When Jews join together in prayer, the individual becomes linked with the Divine, and members of a community are linked to one another.

Conservative Jews

Our members participate on Shabbat and holidays and we follow the triennial cycle of Torah reading.

Egalitarian

Women are an integral part of our congregation. They participate in all aspects of services. In fact, many of our Torah readers are female.

Membership Dues and Dues Consideration

MEMBERSHIP OPTIONS

Family: Includes spouse or domestic partner and any dependent children up to 25 years of age if full-time students. \$1,852

Introductory Young Family: A family whose oldest member is under 35 years of age (available for first-time members only) \$926

<u>Single-Parent</u>: Under 62 years of age with no spouse and one or more dependent children \$1,389

<u>Senior Family</u>: Includes at least one retired spouse 62 years of age or older \$1,389

<u>Single</u>: Under 62 years of age, without spouse or dependent children \$926

<u>Senior Single</u>: 62 years of age or over, retired with no spouse \$695

Family Seasonal: A family who resides in Brevard County for 6 months or less and does not attend High Holiday Services \$463

<u>Single Seasonal</u>: A single member who resides in Brevard County for 6 months or less and does not attend High Holiday services \$278

<u>Virtual:</u> A member who resides outside of Brevard County and would like to access the Temple's online services & programs via Zoom. \$185

ALTERNATE ARRANGEMENTS

Religious School

Temple Beth Sholom is committed to providing our children a comprehensive Jewish education. Our goals go beyond training for the Bar/Bat Mitzvah. We are interested in teaching young people the skills they need to be knowledgeable, productive, contributing Jews in the Conservative movement—Jews who understand the importance of carrying on the beliefs and traditions of Judaism throughout life.

Our services follow the guidelines of the Conservative movement's Rabbinical Assembly. Our minhag (custom) is to count Zoom members only for the Mourner's Kaddish, which we will say if there is a combination of at least 10 Jewish adults present online and in person.
